Dear Dr. Gozin:

Please refer to your Supplemental New Drug Application (sNDA) dated March 5, 2010, received March 5, 2010, submitted under section 505(b) of the Federal Food, Drug, and Cosmetic Act (FDCA) for Advil<sup>®</sup> Liqui-Gels (ibuprofen) capsules, 200 mg.

We acknowledge receipt of your amendments dated February 2, 2011, and April 8, 2011.

The October 29, 2010, submission constituted a complete response to our September 1, 2010, action letter.

This "Changes Being Effected" supplemental new drug application provides for the revised stomach bleeding warning as specified in the Organ-Specific Warnings final rule (21 CFR 201.326) and the removal of the statement "do not take longer than 10 days, unless directed by a doctor (see new warnings)" per the FDA's General Advice letter dated September 4, 2009.

We have completed our review of this application, as amended. It is approved, effective on the date of this letter, for use as recommended in the agreed-upon labeling text.

### **LABELING**

Submit final printed labeling as soon as they are available, but no more than 30 days after they are printed. The final printed labeling (FPL) must be identical to the following enclosed labeling and must be in the "Drug Facts" format (21 CFR 201.66), where applicable.

Advil<sup>®</sup> Liqui-Gels labeling submitted on March 5, 2010:

- 8- and 20-count carton labels (with peel-back Drug Facts)
- 40 –count carton label (representative of the 80-, 120-, and 160-count carton labels)
- 240-count Immediate Container (Bottle) label (with Drug Facts)
- 100-count (50 x 2) immediate container (pouch) label

Advil<sup>®</sup> Liqui-Gels labeling submitted on April 8, 2011:

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- 20-count immediate container (Bottle) Label
- 40-count immediate container (bottle) labeling [representative of the 80-, 120-, and 160count immediate container (bottle) labels]
- 2-count immediate container (pouch) label

Advil<sup>®</sup> Migraine labeling submitted on March 5, 2010:

- 20-count carton label (with peel-back Drug Facts)
- 40-count carton label [representative of the 80-count carton label]

Advil<sup>®</sup> Migraine labeling submitted on April 8, 2011:

- 20-count immediate container (bottle) label
- 40-count immediate container (bottle) label [representative of the 80-count immediate container (bottle label)]

The final printed labeling should be submitted electronically according to the guidance for industry titled "Providing Regulatory Submissions in Electronic Format – Human Pharmaceutical Product Applications and Related Submissions Using the eCTD Specifications (June 2008)." Alternatively, you may submit 12 paper copies, with 6 of the copies individually mounted on heavy-weight paper or similar material. For administrative purposes, designate this submission "**Final Printed Labeling for approved NDA 020402 S-027**." Approval of this submission by FDA is not required before the labeling is used. Please note that representative labeling is not acceptable for Final Printed Labeling (FPL) submissions and that FPL should be submitted in the final to be marketed format.

#### **DRUG REGISTRATION AND LISTING**

All drug establishment registration and drug listing information is to be submitted to FDA electronically, via the FDA automated system for processing structured product labeling (SPL) files (eLIST). At the time that you submit your final printed labeling (FPL), the content of labeling (Drug Facts) should be submitted in SPL format as described at <a href="http://www.fda.gov/ForIndustry/DataStandards/StructuredProductLabeling/default.htm">http://www.fda.gov/ForIndustry/DataStandards/StructuredProductLabeling/default.htm</a>. Information on submitting SPL files using eLIST may be found in the guidance for industry titled "SPL Standard for Content of Labeling Technical Qs and As" at <a href="http://www.fda.gov/downloads/Drugs/GuidanceComplianceRegulatoryInformation/Guidances/U">http://www.fda.gov/downloads/Drugs/GuidanceComplianceRegulatoryInformation/Guidances/U</a> CM072392.pdf. In addition, representative container or carton labeling, whichever includes Drug Facts, (where differences exist only in the quantity of contents statement) should be submitted as a JPG file.

#### **REPORTING REQUIREMENTS**

We remind you that you must comply with reporting requirements for an approved NDA (21 CFR 314.80 and 314.81).
