Dear April Raj:

Please refer to your new drug application (NDA) received February 27, 2026, and your amendments, submitted under section 505(b) of the Federal Food, Drug, and Cosmetic Act (FD&C Act) for Bixlenvo Sunlenca Starter Pack (bictegravir and lenacapavir tablets; lenacapavir tablets).

We also refer to our approval letter dated August 27, 2026, which contained the following errors: omission of the container labels for the individual Bixlenvo and Sunlenca bottles contained within the Starter Pack.

This corrected action letter incorporates the correction of the error. The effective action date will remain August 27, 2026, the date of the original letter.

This NDA provides for the use of Bixlenvo Sunlenca Starter Pack (bictegravir and lenacapavir fixed-dose combination tablets; lenacapavir tablets), a co-packaged product, for the initiation of Bixlenvo, a complete regimen for the treatment of HIV-1 infection, in adults to replace the current antiretroviral regimen in those who are virologically suppressed (HIV-1 RNA less than 50 copies per mL) on a stable antiretroviral regimen with no known or suspected resistance to the individual components of Bixlenvo.

APPROVAL & LABELING

We have completed our review of this application, as amended. It is approved, effective on the date of this letter, for use as recommended in the enclosed agreed-upon labeling.

CONTENT OF LABELING

As soon as possible, but no later than 14 days from the date of this letter, submit the content of labeling [21 CFR 314.50(l)] in structured product labeling (SPL) format using the FDA automated drug registration and listing system (eLIST), as described at

FDA.gov.¹ Content of labeling must be identical to the enclosed labeling (text for the Prescribing Information and Patient Package Insert) as well as annual reportable changes not included in the enclosed labeling. Information on submitting SPL files using eLIST may be found in guidance for industry *SPL Standard for Content of Labeling Technical Qs and As*.²

The SPL will be accessible via publicly available labeling repositories.

CARTON AND CONTAINER LABELING

Submit final printed carton and container labeling that are identical to the enclosed carton and container labeling, as soon as they are available, but no more than 30 days after they are printed. Please submit these labeling electronically according to guidance for industry *SPL Standard for Content of Labeling Technical Qs & As*. For administrative purposes, designate this submission “**Final Printed Carton and Container Labeling for approved NDA 221443.**” Approval of this submission by FDA is not required before the labeling is used.

DATING PERIOD

Based on the stability data submitted to date, the expiry dating period for Bixlenvo Sunlenca Starter Pack (bictegravir and lenacapavir tablets; lenacapavir tablets) shall be 24 months from the date of manufacture when stored at 20°C to 25°C (68°F to 77°F).

ADVISORY COMMITTEE

Your application for Bixlenvo Sunlenca Starter Pack was not referred to an FDA advisory committee because:

- (1) this drug is not the first in its class
- (2) the application did not raise significant safety or efficacy issues that were unexpected for a drug of this class

REQUIRED PEDIATRIC ASSESSMENTS

Under the Pediatric Research Equity Act (PREA) (21 U.S.C. 355c), all applications for new active ingredients (which includes new salts and new fixed combinations), new indications, new dosage forms, new dosing regimens, or new routes of administration are required to contain an assessment of the safety and effectiveness of the product for the claimed indication in pediatric patients unless this requirement is waived, deferred, or inapplicable.

We are waiving the pediatric study requirement for ages birth to less than 2 years because the drug does not represent a meaningful therapeutic benefit over existing therapies for pediatric patients in that age group and it is not likely to be used by a substantial number of pediatric patients in that age group. This is due to the small number of virologically suppressed patients with HIV-1 under 2 years of age who would be eligible to switch to a bictegravir and lenacapavir fixed-dose combination product.

We are deferring submission of your pediatric studies for ages greater than 2 to less than 18 years for this application because this product is ready for approval for use in adults and the pediatric studies have not been completed.

Your deferred pediatric studies required by section 505B(a) of the FD&C Act are required postmarketing studies. The status of these postmarketing studies must be reported annually according to 21 CFR 314.81 and section 505B(a)(4)(C) of the FD&C Act. These required studies are listed below.

- 5040-1 Conduct a study to evaluate the pharmacokinetics, safety, and tolerability of bictegravir/lenacapavir with loading doses of lenacapavir tablets as the initiation regimen for bictegravir/lenacapavir in pediatric participants with HIV-1 infection who are less than 18 years of age and weigh at least 35 kg.

- 5040-2 Conduct a study to evaluate the pharmacokinetics, safety, and tolerability of bictegravir/lenacapavir with loading doses of lenacapavir as the

initiation regimen for bictegravir/lenacapavir in pediatric participants with HIV-1 infection who are at least 2 years old and weigh at least 10 kg and less than 35 kg.

FDA considers the term *final* to mean that the applicant has submitted a protocol, the FDA review team has sent comments to the applicant, and the protocol has been revised as needed to meet the goal of the study or clinical trial. See guidance for industry *Postmarketing Studies and Clinical Trials—Implementation of Section 505(o)(3) of the Federal Food, Drug, and Cosmetic Act*.

Submit the protocol(s) to your IND 158963, with a cross-reference letter to this NDA. Reports of these required pediatric postmarketing studies must be submitted as an NDA or as a supplement to your approved NDA with the proposed labeling changes you believe are warranted based on the data derived from these studies. When submitting the reports, please clearly mark your submission "**SUBMISSION OF REQUIRED PEDIATRIC ASSESSMENTS**" in large font, bolded type at the beginning of the cover letter of the submission.

PROMOTIONAL MATERIALS

You may request advisory comments on proposed introductory advertising and promotional labeling. For information about submitting promotional materials, see guidance for industry *Providing Regulatory Submissions in Electronic and Non-Electronic Format—Promotional Labeling and Advertising Materials for Human Prescription Drugs*.

As required under 21 CFR 314.81(b)(3)(i), you must submit final promotional materials, and the Prescribing Information, at the time of initial dissemination or publication, accompanied by a Form FDA 2253. Form FDA 2253 is available at FDA.gov.³ Information and Instructions for completing the form can be found at FDA.gov.⁴

REPORTING REQUIREMENTS

We remind you that you must comply with reporting requirements for an approved NDA (21 CFR 314.80 and 314.81).

COMPENDIAL STANDARDS

A drug with a name recognized in the official United States Pharmacopeia or official National Formulary (USP-NF) generally must comply with the compendial standards for

strength, quality, and purity, unless the difference in strength, quality, or purity is plainly stated on its label (see FD&C Act § 501(b), 21 USC 351(b)). FDA typically cannot share application-specific information contained in submitted regulatory filings with third parties, which includes USP-NF. To help ensure that a drug continues to comply with compendial standards, application holders may work directly with USP-NF to revise official USP monographs. More information on the USP-NF is available on USP's website⁵.
