RISK EVALUATION AND MITIGATION STRATEGY (REMS)

I. GOALS:

The goals and the objectives of the AVEED REMS are to mitigate the negative outcomes associated with AVEED-induced pulmonary oil microembolism (POME) and anaphylaxis by:

- Ensuring that AVEED is dispensed only in certified healthcare settings that have immediate access on-site to equipment and personnel trained to manage POME and anaphylaxis;
- Informing healthcare providers that AVEED can cause POME and anaphylaxis, which have the potential to lead to serious medical consequences (e.g., respiratory distress and syncope);
- Informing healthcare providers about the safe use of AVEED, including proper administration technique and patient observation; and
- Informing patients about the risks of POME and anaphylaxis associated with AVEED and the importance of remaining at the healthcare setting for 30 minutes after each injection.

II. REMS ELEMENTS:

A. Elements to Assure Safe Use

- 1. Healthcare providers who prescribe AVEED are specially certified.
 - a. Endo Pharmaceuticals Solutions Inc. (Endo) will ensure healthcare providers who prescribe¹ AVEED are specially certified.
 - b. To become specially certified to prescribe AVEED, healthcare providers must:
 - i. Review the Prescribing Information for AVEED;

- ii. Complete the AVEED REMS Education Program for Healthcare Providers (with Knowledge Assessment);
- iii. Agree to provide a copy of the What You Need To Know About AVEED Treatment: A Patient Guide to each patient and review it with patients to inform them about the risks associated with AVEED, including POME and anaphylaxis, and the need to remain at the healthcare setting for 30 minutes following each AVEED injection;
- iv. Acknowledge that they understand how to administer AVEED properly;
- v. Acknowledge that they understand how to manage POME and anaphylaxis;
- vi. Acknowledge that their healthcare setting must be a certified healthcare setting enrolled in the AVEED REMS Program;
- vii. Agree that each patient will be observed in their certified healthcare setting for 30 minutes after each AVEED injection; and
- viii. Complete and sign the *Healthcare Provider Enrollment Form* and submit it to the AVEED REMS Program.
- c. Endo will:
 - i. Ensure that healthcare providers complete the AVEED REMS Education Program for Healthcare Providers (with Knowledge Assessment) and complete the AVEED REMS Healthcare Provider Enrollment Form before activating healthcare providers' certification in the AVEED REMS Program.
 - ii. Ensure that healthcare providers are notified when they have been certified by the AVEED REMS Program.
 - iii. Maintain a validated, secure database of healthcare providers who are certified to prescribe AVEED in the AVEED REMS Program. Endo will ensure that the healthcare providers' certification requirements are met and may de-certify non-compliant healthcare providers if the requirements do not continue to be met.
 - iv. Ensure that the AVEED REMS Education Program for Healthcare Providers (with Knowledge Assessment), AVEED REMS Healthcare Provider Enrollment Form, What You Need To Know About AVEED Treatment: A Patient Guide, and AVEED REMS Program: An Introduction are available on the AVEED REMS Program Website (www.AveedREMS.com) or from Endo's toll-free medical information line (1-800-462-3636) or from the AVEED REMS Program Call Center (1-855-755-0494).
 - v. Provide an Introductory Information Sheet titled *AVEED REMS Program: An Introduction* to healthcare providers who inquire about how to become certified.

- ii. AVEED REMS Healthcare Provider Enrollment Form;

2. AVEED is dispensed² only in certain healthcare settings that are specially certified.

- a. Endo will:
 - i. Ensure that AVEED is only distributed to and dispensed in healthcare settings that are specially certified.
 - ii. Ensure that healthcare settings are re-certified in the AVEED REMS Program every two years.
 - iii. Provide the Information Sheet titled *AVEED REMS Program: An Introduction* to representatives of healthcare settings who inquire about how to become certified.
- b. To become certified, each healthcare setting must designate an Authorized Representative for each location to coordinate the healthcare setting's activities and assure compliance with the AVEED REMS Program. The Authorized Representative must:
 - i. Review the AVEED REMS Education Program for Healthcare Settings;
 - ii. Complete and sign the *AVEED REMS Healthcare Settings Enrollment Form* and agree to establish processes to ensure that:
 - a.) All healthcare providers at the healthcare setting who will prescribe AVEED are specially certified prior to prescribing AVEED;
 - b.) All non-prescribing healthcare providers who dispense AVEED are trained and an up-to-date record of training is maintained;
 - c.) The healthcare setting is equipped with the necessary equipment and personnel to manage POME and anaphylaxis;
 - d.) Each patient is counseled about the risks of POME and anaphylaxis and provided with the *What You Need To Know About AVEED Treatment: A Patient Guide*; and
 - e.) Each patient is observed within the healthcare setting for 30 minutes following each injection;
 - iii. Maintain a record of current certified healthcare providers;
 - iv. Agree not to loan, sell, or transfer AVEED to another healthcare setting, pharmacy, healthcare provider, institution, or distributor, except in the case where the transfer is to another certified healthcare setting (unique ship-to site address) with the same Authorized Representative;
 - v. Monitor and maintain processes and procedures to implement the above requirements; and

vi. Agree to be audited to ensure compliance with the AVEED REMS Program.

The following materials are part of the REMS and are appended:

- i. AVEED REMS Education Program for Healthcare Settings; and
- ii. AVEED REMS Healthcare Setting Enrollment Form.

B. Implementation System

An implementation system will be established for the AVEED REMS Program to monitor and evaluate whether the elements to assure safe use are meeting the program's goals.

Endo will:

- 1. Ensure that healthcare settings that dispense AVEED are specially certified.
- 2. Maintain, monitor, and evaluate the implementation of the AVEED REMS Program:
 - a. Endo will maintain a validated, secure database of all certified healthcare settings.
 - b. Endo will send confirmation of certification to each certified healthcare setting.
 - c. The database of certified healthcare providers will be accessible by the Authorized Representative at the certified healthcare setting.
 - d. Endo will maintain an AVEED REMS Program Call Center (1-855-755-0494) to respond to questions from healthcare providers and healthcare settings.
 - e. Endo will ensure that all materials listed in or appended to the AVEED REMS are available through the AVEED REMS Program website (www.AveedREMS.com) or through the AVEED REMS Program Call Center (1-855-755-0494).
 - f. Endo will maintain a website to facilitate operation of the AVEED REMS Program, which will serve as one method by which healthcare providers and healthcare setting Authorized Representatives can receive education and enroll in the AVEED REMS Program.
 - g. Endo will audit all certified healthcare settings within 180 days after the healthcare setting is certified to ensure they have implemented the AVEED REMS Program as directed. Thereafter, Endo will include the certified healthcare settings in the company's annual audit plan.
- 3. Ensure that wholesalers/distributors verify healthcare setting certification prior to distributing AVEED.
- 4. Ensure that wholesalers/distributors maintain distribution records of all shipments of AVEED.
- 5. Take reasonable steps to improve implementation of these elements and to maintain compliance with the AVEED REMS program requirements, as applicable.

C. Timetable for Submissions of Assessments

Endo will submit REMS Assessments to FDA at 6 months and 12 months from the date of REMS approval, and then annually thereafter. To facilitate inclusion of as much information as possible while allowing reasonable time to prepare the submission, the reporting interval covered by each assessment should conclude no earlier than 60 days before the submission date for that assessment. Endo will submit each assessment so that it will be received by the FDA on or before the due date.

- This healthcare setting must not dispense AVEED for home or patient self-administration.
- To make available to Endo Pharmaceuticals Solutions Inc. (Endo), and/or a designated third party or the FDA, documentation to verify understanding of, and adherence to, the requirements of the AVEED REMS Program.

What is the AVEED REMS (Risk Evaluation and Mitigation Strategy) Program?

A REMS is a strategy to manage known or potential risks associated with a drug, and is required by the FDA to ensure that the benefits of the drug outweigh its risks. AVEED is available only under a restricted program called the AVEED REMS Program because of the risks of serious pulmonary oil microembolism (POME) reactions and anaphylaxis.

AVEED REMS Program Requirements

Healthcare settings must be certified in the AVEED REMS Program to be able to order AVEED. One representative needs to enroll per healthcare setting (the "Authorized Representative").

Prescribing Healthcare Providers must be certified in the AVEED REMS Program to be able to prescribe AVEED. Prescribing healthcare providers cannot complete certification until their healthcare setting is enrolled.

Non-Prescribing Healthcare Providers who will administer AVEED to patients must be trained on the AVEED REMS Education for Healthcare Providers.

Safe Use Actions You Must Implement for AVEED

- Ensure all healthcare providers who prescribe AVEED at your healthcare setting are certified in the AVEED REMS program
- Ensure all non-prescribing healthcare providers who administer AVEED are trained on:

Indication

AVEED[™] (testosterone undecanoate) injection is an androgen indicated for testosterone replacement therapy in adult males for conditions associated with a deficiency or absence of endogenous testosterone:

- Primary hypogonadism (congenital or acquired)
- Hypogonadotropic hypogonadism (congenital or acquired)

AVEED should only be used in patients who require testosterone replacement therapy and in whom the benefits of the product outweigh the serious risks of POME and anaphylaxis.

Serious Risks of POME and Anaphylaxis

With <u>each</u> AVEED injection, there is a potential for serious POME reactions or anaphylaxis to occur. These reactions can occur after any injection of AVEED during the course of therapy, including after the first dose.

The signs and symptoms of serious POME reactions and anaphylaxis overlap. It is important to observe patients in your healthcare setting for 30 minutes after each AVEED injection to determine whether medical intervention is necessary.

Serious POME reactions

POME occurring after an AVEED injection is believed to be caused by tiny droplets of oil, in which the testosterone undecanoate has been dissolved, that have traveled to the lungs.

- POME is **not** a blood clot
- There is a risk of POME occurring with each injection of AVEED

Symptoms of POME

The following symptoms of POME have been reported with AVEED:

– cough

- throat tightening
- urge to cough
- dyspnea

- dizziness

- chest pain

- hyperhidrosis
- syncope
- The majority of these events lasted a few minutes and resolved with supportive measures
- Some of the events lasted up to several hours and in some cases, emergency care and/or hospitalization were required

Anaphylaxis

Episodes of anaphylaxis, including life-threatening reactions, have been reported to occur following AVEED injection.



Strategies That May Mitigate These Risks:

- Take proper precautions and avoid injecting AVEED intravascularly
- Inject AVEED slowly (over 60 to 90 seconds)
- AVEED should not be used or should be discontinued in men with any known hypersensitivity to AVEED or to any of its ingredients (testosterone undecanoate, refined castor oil, benzyl benzoate)
- 30 Minute Post-Injection Patient Observation
 - Observe patients in your healthcare setting for a period of 30 minutes after each AVEED injection to provide appropriate medical treatment in the event of serious POME reactions or anaphylaxis
 - The majority of cases reported occurred during or within 30 minutes of the injection
- Your healthcare setting must have immediate access on-site to equipment and personnel trained to manage serious POME reactions and anaphylaxis


Proper Administration

AVEED is for intramuscular use only. Intravascular injection may lead to POME.

Only healthcare providers trained in the proper injection technique for AVEED should administer AVEED.

Proper Injection Technique for AVEED Intramuscular Injection

- **1.** The site for injection for AVEED is the gluteus medius muscle site located in the upper outer quadrant of the buttock. Care must be taken to avoid the needle hitting the superior gluteal arteries and sciatic nerve.
- 2. Following antiseptic skin preparation, enter the muscle and maintain the syringe at a 90° angle with the needle in its deeply imbedded position. Grasp the barrel of the syringe firmly with one hand. With the other hand, pull back on the plunger to aspirate for blood. IF BLOOD APPEARS IN THE SYRINGE DO NOT PROCEED WITH THE INJECTION, as this is an indication that a blood vessel may have been punctured. Immediately withdraw the needle completely and replace it.
- **3.** If no blood is aspirated, reinforce the current needle position to avoid any movement of the needle and slowly (over 60 to 90 seconds) depress the plunger carefully and at a constant rate, until all the medication has been delivered. Be sure to depress the plunger completely with sufficient controlled force. Withdraw the needle.



4. Observe the patient in the healthcare setting for 30 minutes after the injection in order to provide appropriate medical treatment in the event of a serious POME reaction or anaphylaxis.



Patient Counseling

With each injection of AVEED:

- Review the AVEED Patient Counseling Tool ("What You Need to Know about AVEED Treatment: A Patient Guide") with patients and caregivers.
- Give the Patient Counseling Tool to the patient to read during their 30 minute wait in your healthcare setting.

Explain to patients:

- The importance of providing an accurate medical history about any previous allergic reactions to AVEED or its components (testosterone undecanoate, castor oil and benzyl benzoate)
- AVEED can only be administered by a trained HCP in a certified healthcare setting
- The risks of serious POME reactions and anaphylaxis associated with AVEED
- POME is not a blood clot
- How to recognize the symptoms of serious POME reactions and anaphylaxis
- Report signs and symptoms to the healthcare setting staff immediately. These include:
- swelling of your face, tongue, or throat
- hoarseness or trouble speaking
- difficulty breathing
- feeling flushed
- itching or rash including hives

- coughing or urge to cough
- tightening in your throat
- numbness and tingling in your arms
- dizziness
- feeling very sweaty

- chest pain
- feeling unwell
- fainting
- pain in your stomach
- vomiting or throwing up
- The importance of waiting in the healthcare setting for 30 minutes post-injection to provide for appropriate medical treatment in the event of a serious POME reaction or anaphylaxis.
- The AVEED REMS Patient Counseling Tool contains an AVEED Injection Tracking Sheet. The purpose of this sheet is that the patient's injection time and scheduled departure time 30 minutes apart can be recorded by the HCP and given to the patient. The patient will then know when they have waited 30 minutes and can leave the healthcare setting accordingly. Explain the importance of this tool to your patients and encourage them to use it every time.

What is the AVEED REMS (Risk Evaluation and Mitigation Strategy) Program?

A REMS is a strategy to manage known or potential risks associated with a drug, and is required by the FDA to ensure that the benefits of the drug outweigh its risks. AVEED is available only under a restricted program called the AVEED REMS Program because of the risks of serious pulmonary oil microembolism (POME) reactions and anaphylaxis. The AVEED REMS Education Program for Healthcare Settings is designed to train healthcare setting Authorized Representatives on these serious risks, and AVEED REMS Program requirements to order AVEED for their healthcare setting.

- Healthcare settings must be certified in the AVEED REMS Program to be able to order AVEED.
- Prescribing Healthcare Providers must be certified in the AVEED REMS Program to be able to prescribe AVEED.
- **Non-Prescribing Healthcare Providers** who will administer AVEED to patients must review the AVEED REMS Education for Healthcare Providers before injecting AVEED.

Steps for Healthcare Setting Certification

1	Designate an Authorized Representative	
2	Review the AVEED REMS Education Program for Healthcare Settings, including the Prescribing Information	
3	Complete and sign the Healthcare Setting Enrollment Form. This Enrollment must be renewed every 2 years	
4	Implement the necessary staff training and processes to comply with the AVEED REMS Program requirements

- 2. Healthcare providers who prescribe AVEED at your healthcare setting are certified in the AVEED REMS Program

Who Can Be An Authorized Representative?

An Authorized Representative at the healthcare setting can be a:

- Prescribing healthcare providers
- Non-prescribing healthcare providers
- Practice manager
- Or, any responsible individual in the healthcare setting

Please check with your manager to ensure the appropriate person represents the healthcare setting and attests to the enrollment requirements as stated on the Healthcare Setting Enrollment Form.

- One representative needs to enroll per healthcare setting (the "Authorized Representative"). One Authorized Representative can manage more than one healthcare setting.
- Please note, there are no AVEED REMS requirements for staff at a healthcare setting that will not be involved with prescribing or administering AVEED.



Indication

AVEED™ (testosterone undecanoate) injection is an androgen indicated for testosterone replacement therapy in adult males for conditions associated with a deficiency or absence of endogenous testosterone:

- Primary hypogonadism (congenital or acquired)
- Hypogonadotropic hypogonadism (congenital or acquired)

AVEED should only be used in patients who require testosterone replacement therapy and in whom the benefits of the product outweigh the serious risks of POME and anaphylaxis.

Serious Risks of POME and Anaphylaxis

With <u>each</u> AVEED injection, there is a potential for serious POME reactions or anaphylaxis to occur. These reactions can occur after any injection of AVEED during the course of therapy, including after the first dose.

The signs and symptoms of serious POME reactions and anaphylaxis overlap. It is important to observe patients in your healthcare setting for 30 minutes after each AVEED injection to determine whether medical intervention is necessary.

Serious POME reactions

POME occurring after an AVEED injection is believed to be caused by tiny droplets of oil, in which the testosterone undecanoate has been dissolved, that have traveled to the lungs.

- POME is not a blood clot
- There is a risk of POME occurring with each injection of AVEED

Symptoms of POME

The following symptoms of POME have been reported with AVEED:

- cough
- urge to cough
- dyspnea
- hyperhidrosis

- throat tightening
- chest pain
- dizziness
- syncope
- The majority of these events lasted a few minutes and resolved with supportive measures
- Some of the events lasted up to several hours and in some cases, emergency care and/or hospitalization were required

Anaphylaxis

Episodes of anaphylaxis, including life-threatening reactions, have been reported to occur following AVEED injection.



Strategies to implement in your healthcare setting to mitigate these risks:

- Ensure all healthcare providers who prescribe AVEED are certified in the AVEED REMS program
 - Maintain up-to-date records
- Ensure all non-prescribing healthcare providers who administer AVEED are trained on:
 - Serious POME reactions and anaphylaxis
 - Patient counseling
 - 30 minute post-injection patient observation
 - Proper administration of AVEED
- Maintain an up-to-date record of training
- Establish a process to ensure all patients are counseled about AVEED and receive "What You Need To Know About AVEED Treatment: A Patient Guide"
- Establish a process to ensure each patient is observed for 30 minutes at your healthcare setting after each AVEED injection
- Have the necessary equipment and personnel on-site to manage serious POME reactions or anaphylaxis
- Ensure a patient is NEVER provided AVEED for home or self-injection

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What You Need to Know About AVEED[™] Treatment: A Patient Guide

Patients: Your doctor or nurse will go over this Patient Guide with you. It is important to ask any questions you might have prior to each time AVEED is given to you. Keep this guide for important safety information about the serious risks and reactions of AVEED.

Healthcare Providers: Review this Patient Guide with your patient <u>each time</u> an injection is given and provide your patient a copy to take home. Record the patient's injection time and scheduled departure from your office (30 minutes apart) on the back of this sheet.

What is AVEED?

AVEED is a prescription medicine that contains testosterone. AVEED is used to treat adult males who have a condition called hypogonadism. You and your healthcare provider have determined that AVEED is an appropriate treatment for you.

AVEED is only available at your doctor's office, clinic, or hospital. It is not a medicine you will give yourself at home because of the serious risks of AVEED.

What is the Most Serious Risk Information about AVEED Treatment?

- AVEED can cause a serious lung problem called a **pulmonary oil microembolism (POME)**. POME is NOT a blood clot. AVEED contains castor oil and POME is believed to be caused by tiny droplets of castor oil that may travel to the lungs.
- AVEED may also cause a severe allergic reaction called **anaphylaxis**.

These reactions can occur with <u>any</u> AVEED injection during your treatment, even if you have not had a reaction occur before.

You need to stay in the doctor's office, clinic, or hospital for 30 minutes after receiving <u>each</u> AVEED injection to be sure that you are not experiencing these serious side effects.

What are the Signs of POME or Anaphylaxis After Receiving AVEED?

Prompt emergency medical attention is important if you have signs or symptoms of a serious side effect after receiving an AVEED injection.

After receiving an injection of AVEED, tell your doctor or nurse if you have any of the following signs or symptoms during the 30-minute wait. Your doctor or nurse will instruct you about getting emergency medical attention if these signs or symptoms occur after leaving the doctor's office:

- swelling of your face, tongue, or throat
- hoarseness or trouble speaking
- difficulty breathing
- feeling flushed
- itching or rash including hives

- coughing or urge to cough
- tightening in your throat
- numbness and tingling in your arms
- dizziness
- feeling very sweaty

- chest pain
- feeling unwell
- fainting
- pain in your stomach
- vomiting or throwing up



These are **NOT** all the possible side effects of AVEED. Refer to the AVEED Medication Guide that you were given or talk to your doctor or nurse for medical advice about other side effects.

What Can I Do to Help Reduce the Risks of AVEED?

- 1. Tell your doctor or nurse if you have ever had an allergic reaction to AVEED or any of its ingredients. The ingredients in AVEED are:
 - testosterone undecanoate
 - castor oil
 - benzyl benzoate

2. After each AVEED injection:

Stay in the doctor's office, clinic, or hospital for 30 minutes after receiving <u>each</u> AVEED injection to be sure that you are not experiencing any serious side effects.

How Often Will I Receive an Injection of AVEED?

You will get 1 injection when you start, 1 injection 4 weeks later, and then 1 injection every 10 weeks thereafter.
