

**Draft Guidance on Mecamylamine Hydrochloride**

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**Active Ingredient:** Mecamylamine hydrochloride

**Dosage Form:** Tablet

**Route:** Oral

**Strength:** 2.5 mg

**Recommended Study:** One in vivo bioequivalence study with pharmacokinetic endpoints

1. Type of study: Fasting

Design: Single-dose, two-treatment, two-period crossover in vivo

Strength: 2.5 mg

Subjects: Healthy males and non-pregnant, non-lactating females

Additional comments: None

**Analyte to measure:** Mecamylamine in plasma

**Bioequivalence based on (90% CI):** Mecamylamine

**Waiver request of in vivo testing:** Not applicable

**Dissolution test method and sampling times:** The dissolution information for this drug product can be found in the FDA's Dissolution Methods database, <http://www.accessdata.fda.gov/scripts/cder/dissolution>. Conduct comparative dissolution testing on 12 dosage units for each of the test and reference listed drug (RLD) products.<sup>1</sup> Specifications will be determined upon review of the abbreviated new drug application.
