Draft Guidance on Indomethacin

October 2024

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Active Ingredient: Indomethacin

Dosage Form: Capsule

Route: Oral

Strengths: 25 mg, 50 mg

Recommended Study: One in vivo bioequivalence study with pharmacokinetic endpoints

1. Type of study: Fasting
Design: Single-dose, two-treatment, two-period crossover in vivo
Strength: 50 mg
Subjects: Healthy males and non-pregnant, non-lactating females
Additional comments: None

Analyte to measure: Indomethacin in plasma

Bioequivalence based on (90% CI): Indomethacin

Waiver request of in vivo testing: 25 mg strength based on (i) acceptable bioequivalence study on the 50 mg strength, (ii) acceptable in vitro dissolution testing of both strengths, and (iii) proportional similarity of the formulations between both strengths

Dissolution test method and sampling times: The dissolution information for this drug product can be found in the FDA's Dissolution Methods database, <http://www.accessdata.fda.gov/scripts/cder/dissolution/>. Conduct comparative dissolution testing on 12 dosage units for each of both strengths of the test product and reference listed drug (RLD).¹ Specifications will be determined upon review of the abbreviated new drug application.
