Draft Guidance on Drospirenone; Ethinyl Estradiol

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Active Ingredients:	Drospirenone; Ethinyl estradiol
Dosage Form:	Tablet
Route:	Oral-28
Strength:	3 mg; 0.03 mg
Recommended Study:	One in vivo bioequivalence study with pharmacokinetic endpoints
1.	Type of study: Fasting Design: Single-dose, two-treatment, two-period crossover in vivo Strength: 3 mg; 0.03 mg Subjects: Healthy non-pregnant, non-lactating females Additional comments: None
Analytes to measure:	Drospirenone and ethinyl estradiol in plasma
Bioequivalence based on (90% CI):	Drospirenone and ethinyl estradiol
Waiver request of in vivo testing:	Not applicable

Conduct comparative dissolution testing on 12 dosage units for each of the test product and reference listed drug (RLD).¹ Specifications will be determined upon review of the abbreviated new drug application.
