## **Draft Guidance on Citalopram Hydrobromide**

**October 2024**

This draft guidance, when finalized, will represent the current thinking of the Food and Drug Administration (FDA, or the Agency) on this topic. It does not establish any rights for any person and is not binding on FDA or the public. 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**Active Ingredient:** Citalopram hydrobromide

**Dosage Form:** Capsule

**Route:** Oral

**Strengths:** EQ 10 mg Base, EQ 20 mg Base, EQ 40 mg Base

**Recommended Study:** One in vivo bioequivalence study with pharmacokinetic endpoints

1. Type of study: Fasting  
Design: Single-dose, two-treatment, two-period crossover in vivo  
Strength: EQ 40 mg Base  
Subjects: Healthy males and non-pregnant, non-lactating females  
Additional comments: Females of reproductive potential should use effective contraception during the study.

**Analyte to measure:** Citalopram in plasma

**Bioequivalence based on (90% CI):** Citalopram

**Waiver request of in vivo testing:** EQ 10 mg Base and EQ 20 mg Base strengths based on (i) acceptable bioequivalence study on the EQ 40 mg Base strength, (ii) acceptable in vitro dissolution testing across all strengths, and (iii) proportional similarity of the formulations across all strengths

**Dissolution test method and sampling times:** The dissolution information for this drug product can be found in the FDA’s Dissolution Methods database, <http://www.accessdata.fda.gov/scripts/cder/dissolution/>. Conduct comparative dissolution testing on 12 dosage units for each of all strengths of the test product and reference listed drug (RLD).<sup>1</sup> Specifications will be determined upon review of the abbreviated new drug application.
